- The continuation of home learning/online learning continues with every student being able to work on their learning journey through specifically designated learning packs for a few and with the 155 chromebooks having been distributed to our students.
- Bubble operations adhered to physical distancing; hygiene; limited staffing and students on site.

I hope that your child/ren has shown you the weekly montage of our learning AND the staff video we have made for the students – we are all missing them.

Work continues at school with building developments, refurbishments and battling the leaves.

It is great to hear from the staff how our students are working positively with their tasks. Thank you for also checking in with the staff. We are working hard to ensure that our students are having a positive experience in this unprecedented time.

I am rapt to receive photos of our students in action with their learning and have viewed much of the work that teachers have collated during this time – a comprehensive source of evidence of learning.

Thank you to all the parents, caregivers and whanau who have had to return to work for your efforts in keeping our nation progressing.
