FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK ...

Kia ora koutou katoa

Here we are in an unusual time. We have known COVID-19 would spread across the motu and West Auckland communities have been impacted by the virus. At BMIS we are doing as much as possible to continue to operate as safely as possible, implementing the mitigation strategies to keep our community as safe as possible.

COVID-19 UPDATE:

At BMIS we are observing the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education guidelines. These do change and we are keeping abreast of the changes.

To protect everyone's privacy, we are not able to give you any personal information about any positive COVID-19 case we may get at school (staff or students).

We know in situations like this rumours and misinformation can often circulate - please know that any information that you need to know will come directly from Bruce McLaren Intermediate.

Please note:

If your child (BMIS student) is a positive COVID-19 case: They have been tested with a positive result and are isolating. Please advise the school as soon as possible.

If your child is a CLOSE CONTACT of a positive BMIS student/staff: You will be phoned, child collected and emailed next steps as outlined by the MOH & MOE.

If your child is NOT a positive case/NOT a Close Contact: Your child is to attend school. Life as we know it.

If your child is unwell: Please keep them home from school.

In this stage of the CPF RED Phase 2, I encourage parents/caregivers to be vigilant and watch out for the signs and

symptoms of the virus. These are:

- new or worsening cough
- Sneezing and runny nose
- A fever
- Temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste
- Sore throat
- · Shortness of breath

Less common symptoms include diarrhoea, headache, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, malaise, chest pain, abdominal pain, joint pain, or confusion/irritability.

Many schools are having to close due to staff and students being unwell and switching to distance learning from home. At BMIS, distance learning from home is our last resort. However, we are ready - should we need to do this. Your children will have their MathsBuddy logon, Education Perfect Logon, have SeeSaw and Googleclassroom set. These are the platforms that are expected to be used by your children. Please note, you will not be contacted by staff through their personal social media platforms. Teaching and learning takes place through our school platforms this is for the safety of everyone.

MASKS:

Please ensure students arrrive at school each day with a mask.

END OF DAY:

In CPF RED our students are staggered when leaving school to reduce congestion at the gate.

Departing times are:

Bus students to the hall at 2:45pm

Atawhai: 2:45pm Mahi Tahi: 2:50pm Manawanui: 2:55pm Manaaki: 3:00pm No student is to wait outside the school gates. The Bus Bay is for buses only. There are many spots around the school that make for safe pick up areas. Please ensure you discuss this with your child so that no student is left waiting at school after 3:10pm.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

Our UNIFORM is the window to our school. Our students wear their uniforms with pride. Full school 'formal uniform' and 'PE uniform' should be in tip top shape by now – from head to toe. Should your child not have the correct uniforms, they must have a note from home indicating as to why – we maybe able to help out.

DEVICES:

Devices are brought to school with parental permission. These are not the responsibility of the school. Devices (cellphones, google watches, ...) are collected at 8:30am and returned to students at 2:55pm.

It is encouraged to keep devices safe at home. Any device found on a student during the school day will be removed and home will be called to collect.

MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS:

Please make all plans for pick up and after school activities before leaving home in the morning. We do understand situations can change during the day - if this happens, students are welcome to use the school office phone should they need to make contact with home, or in an emergency, parents/caregivers can call the front office and leave a message for your child. We do ask that you please call before 2:00pm.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank our parents and whanau for your kind words of encouragement, support and praise for what BMIS is doing to maintain and progress the teaching and learning of your children, especially in RED Phase 2.

Our approach is open and friendly at BMIS and CPF RED is certainly not how any principal or staff member envisages commencing the school year.
