

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK ...

Kia ora koutou katoa

Week 6, of Term 1 is racing by.

It is superb to have so many students engaged in their learning on site. SCHOOL IS OPEN. Learning is at school, even in RED. Thank you to our school families for keeping us safe on site by always monitoring your child/ren for any symptoms and keeping them home if they are unwell.

ISOLATING STUDENTS:

If students are isolating – learning online with Education Perfect and MathsBuddy using SeeSaw and googleclassroom continues or through a hard pack of learning.

If your child (BMIS student) is a positive COVID-19 case: They have been tested with a positive result and are isolating. Please advise the school as soon as possible.

If your child is a HOUSEHOLD CONTACT: They will isolate at home. Please advise the school as soon as possible.

If your child is NOT a positive case/NOT a Household Contact: Your child is to attend school. Life as we know it.

If your child is unwell: Please keep them home from school.

In this stage of the CPF RED Phase 2, I encourage parents/caregivers to be vigilant and watch out for the signs and symptoms of the virus. These are:

- new or worsening cough
- sneezing and runny nose
- a fever •
- temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste
- sore throat •
- shortness of breath

Less common symptoms include diarrhoea, headache, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, malaise, chest pain, abdominal pain, joint pain, or confusion/ irritability.

ON SITE LEARNING:

Again, we have been incredibly fortunate to have our staff and students remain well. BMIS is observing the health and safety mitigations which support the limiting of transmission of COVID-19 in our school. We are powering through sanitizer and sunblock! Thank you for ensuring your child is wearing a mask. We are taking our learning outdoors when we can as well - check out the pictures in the newsletter.

Students are completing a Science Survey which will gauge how they feel about their learnings of Science to date and what interests them.

BEGINNING OF YEAR TESTING:

Beginning of Year testing (e-asTTLe, IKAN, STAR, GloSs, PROBE) is completed, with a few catch ups in the pipeline. This is a great indicator as to where a student is at, set goals for the term and ensure that areas of development are targeted. You will see your child's Goal Setting Sheets on their SeeSaw profile. Please take the time to discuss this with your child. Student goals are supported by their classroom teacher and are referred to regularly so that every increment to achieving the goal/s is celebrated.

MY PERSONAL BEST - LEARNER PROFILE CHECK IN MEETINGS:

"My Personal Best - Learner Profile" will be completed this term and, with fingers crossed, we will be able to host our Check In meetings with parents, caregivers and students on site to discuss these.

The date for the evening is: Thursday, 7 April from 1:00pm - 8:00pm. School will close at 12.30pm to accommodate slots. More information about how to book will be sent out closer to the time.

Please note that these meetings will only go ahead if we are out of the RED light setting.

Ritchies bus students can be collected or registered through the front office by parents, to wait until bus collection at the end of the school day, while supervised in the Library.

STAFF ONLY DAY:

On Thursday, 14 April, BMIS will be closed for a Staff Only Day. This day is part of the Primary Teachers' Collective Agreement. Staff will be immersed in professional development. The school will be closed to students.

TERM BREAK:

Easter is looming. The term break is from Thursday, 14 April – Sunday, 1 May. School is closed over this time.
