This time will be an opportunity for parents/ whānau/caregivers to have quality time to discuss how your child is settling in to their learning and mahi at Bruce McLaren Intermediate School. A time can be booked through the online system or by emailing or ringing the school office.

GENERAL:

- Bucket hat must be worn in Term 1 and 4.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING:

Students only cross the road ONCE to come to school and once going home from school. This is to be at the PEDESTRIAN CROSSING for safety.

PARKING AT SCHOOL:

Just a reminder that there is to be NO PARKING IN THE BUS BAY - this is for buses only. If you are picking your child up from school, please park in one of the side streets and arrange for your child to walk the short distance to meet you. The shops carpark opposite the school is not ideal due to traffic congestion, pedestrian traffic and delivery of vehicles.

Students, when entering school, are to turn devices off as they enter the school gates and turn them on again as they leave the school gates at the end of the day. Students, when entering school, are to get off bicycles, scooters, skateboards and skates at the school gate for everyone's safety. No helmet - no ride.
