Year 8s heading to secondary school for Year 9, 2024 are to now be enrolled. Every BMIS Year 8 student must know where they are going next year.

Not only is there change for our students, there is also change for **staffing in 2024**. We farewell Mr Tony Jee who is relocating to a school closer to home. We wish him well with his teaching career.

Welcome to Tracy Leaoa as Assistant Principal, Whānau Leader and Teacher. We look forward to having her join our staff and know that our school community will make her very welcome.

As of the 1st February, I will be on Primary Principals' Collective Agreement; Refreshment Leave which entitles Primary Principals to up to one year's leave after seven years of service. Ms Ah Chong will be Acting Principal with Mrs Few as Acting Deputy Principal during 2024. Please be aware that "I am on leave – I am NOT leaving". BMIS is in an extremely strong position for 2024+.

The final lap is in sight. The pace is fast and focused for our ākonga and staff. At the end of each year we **farewell Year 8 students**. This year, Year 8 students will be acknowledged with a Leaver's Certificate for their eight years of primary education and two years at intermediate school at our **Service Prize Giving**, being held on Thursday, 7th December at 12pm. This is also when students who have volunteered their time for duties to support the running of the school will also be acknowledged eg Road patrollers.

Formal Prize Giving is when students will be acknowledged for achieving a school award, school prize and/or school cup. This will be held on Thursday, 14th December at 9:30am. Parents/whānau of students receiving one (or more) of these awards will be notified by the school before the end of Week 9 – next week.

As Thursday, 14th December is the last day of the school year, students will stay at school after the Formal Prize Giving until 3pm.

Should you wish to take your child after the Formal Prize Giving, this **MUST** be pre-arranged by Wednesday, 13th December, 12pm. Any child who leaves the school site **MUST** be signed out at the office by an adult listed on the child's record housed at the office. Safety is paramount.

Any whānau of a Year 8 student who wishes to donate uniform to the school will be able to do so Block 3 on Thursday, 14th December. Only Year 8 students **donating uniform** will be able to change into mufti at this time.

End of Year Reports will be addressed and brought home to you by your child – in a sealed envelope, on Friday, 8th December. Kaiako have spent much time analysing, evaluating, assessing, and conferencing with your child and their learning to provide you with the best information and next steps for your child's ongoing learning journey. Please read the End of Year Report in conjunction with your child's SeeSaw learning profile.

As at writing this newsletter, Whānau Atawhai are headed to Parakai today to celebrate their year of learning. Regardless of what the weather has in store for them, they will certainly have fun.

Thank you to all the parents and adults who have and are still assisting with supporting events and activities so that we can provide our ākonga with amazing learning opportunities while having fun.

GENERAL

- Black sandals are to be worn in Term 4.

- BMIS prides itself on the standard of school uniform worn by our students along with appropriate language and behaviour. Nothing less is acceptable.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING:

Students only cross the road **ONCE** to come to school and **ONCE** going home from school. This is to be at the **PEDESTRIAN CROSSING**.

PARKING AT SCHOOL:

Just a reminder that there is to be **NO PARKING IN THE BUS BAY** - this is for buses only. If you are picking your child up from school, please park in one of the side streets and arrange for your child to walk the short distance to meet you. The shops' carpark opposite the school is not ideal due to traffic congestion, pedestrian traffic and delivery of vehicles.

OFF AT THE GATE :

Discussion with your child about **OFF AT THE GATE** is imperative. Students, when entering school, are to turn devices off as they enter the school gates and turn them on again as they leave the school gates at the end of the day. All home devices are placed in a class box at 8.30am and returned by 3.00pm. Students, when entering school, are to get off bicycles, scooters, skateboards and skates at the school gate for everyone's safety. No helmet - no ride. Please support the school in safeguarding everyone.

Come on students, let's have a class get over 95% attendance for every week.

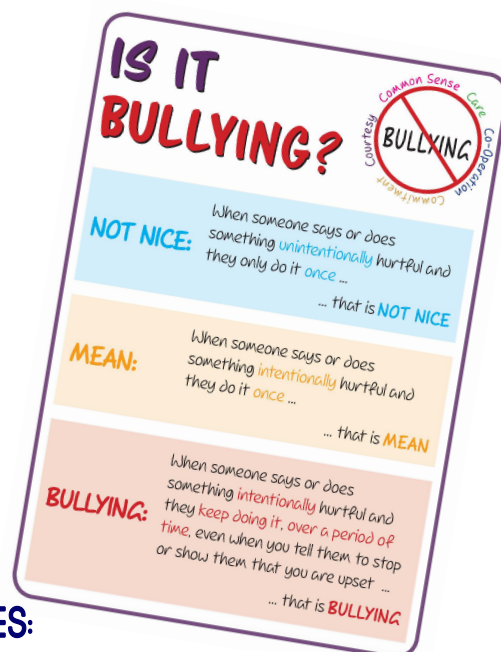
