#### CHANGES FOR 2020:

2020 is seeing many changes at Bruce McLaren Intermediate School. To name a few – new classrooms being built, new staff, new learning opportunities, the introduction of Hospitality to integrate with Food Technology, introduction of a specialist for Performing

Arts – Dance, Drama, Music, new furniture for classrooms, new technology for classrooms, updating of the Admin area, and the removal of excess fill from around the grounds. Growth and continued improvement keeps us extremely busy.

#### STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Curriculum and pedagogy are key to student success. Therefore, professional development this year for staff is about enhancing programmes to ensure progress and achievement continues to accelerate student outcomes. Of which we are proud of our teaching and learning journey to date.

#### CONTACT WITH THE TEACHER:

Should you have any queries about your child's learning, the class teacher is the first port of call. It is best to email the teacher directly to co-ordinate a meeting/discussion in person. Kanohi te kanohi (face to face) is the preferred method of communication so that any complements or concerns are addressed in person - accordingly.

#### COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL:

SkoolLoop is our primary method of communication with parents/whanau. Have the app downloaded to your cellphone.

The school website, electronic sign and emails are also methods of communication with our community.

NEWSLETTERS ARE ELECTRONIC – SENT BY EMAIL to your email address provided on the enrolment form. Should you need to check that your email is up to date, please contact the School Office. These are produced once per fortnight and house important information.

#### UNIFORM & STATIONERY:

It is important to ensure that your child is in correct uniform and has stationery. This should have been completed before commencing school.

### **OFF AT THE GATE:**

Discussion with your child about OFF AT THE GATE is imperative. Students, when entering school, are to turn devices off as they enter the school gates and turn them on again as they leave the school gates at the end of the day. Students, when entering school, are to get off bicycles, scooters, skateboards and skates at the school gate for everyone's safety. No helmet - no ride.

### **PIT STOP, SPORT & OPPORTUNITIES DAY:**

### **SCHOOL SWIMMING:**

School Swimming will take place on Friday, 14th February at Henderson High School. Mr Brett McKenzie is the TIC for this brilliant day. More information will be issued soon.

### **MEET THE TEACHER:**

On Wednesday, 12 February from 6.00pm - 7.00pm, parents/whanau are invited to Meet the Teacher evening. This will commence in the hall followed by a visit to your child's classroom where you can meet the teacher. This is NOT a personalised meeting, it is a chance to put faces to names and hear about processes, practices and programmes your child will be immersed in. Come along and have a BBQ sausage while your child shows you around their school.

### **EFFORT REPORT EVENING:**

Effort Report Evenings will be held during Week 8 of Term 1 where parents/whanau will meet with the teacher to discuss your child's application to learning.

### **SCHOOL ARRIVALS & DEPARTURES:**

Teachers are in classrooms from 8:15am to welcome students to the new day. It has been observed that some students are arriving as early as 6:55am! This is a safety issue. There is no-one to supervise these students at this time as staff are working to prepare for the day.

Students should only be arriving at school AFTER 8am+ (this is still early!).

All students leave the school at 3.00pm. Any students waiting for parents/whanau are required to sit by the school hall. No student is to wait outside the school gate. It is wise to discuss a pick up point away from the school gate (by The Hub, along Corban Ave, Heremai Road, Hulme Place, Silverstone Place, ... not loitering at the

shops, waiting!). THE BUS BAY IS FOR BUSES ONLY.

The car parks are for staff. Should you be wanting to access the School Office use the car park by the big palm tree.

We aim to keep all of our students and staff safe. Thank you for helping us do this.

### **SCHOOL BUS UPDATE:**

Ritchies have had some teething issues. Just a reminder that we share our school buses with Oratia Primary and Henderson High school. The Piha bus leaves school around 3.05pm but the Oratia Bus and the Opanuku Bus do not collect our students until around 3.30pm after school. We rely on Ritchies to let us know if buses are not running to schedule and if this is the case we will put updates on our Skool Loop App. Thank you for your patience. Our patience is also being tested!

### **ENROLMENTS:**

It has been an incredible start to the year with 30+ students enrolling within the last four weeks. As you can imagine, a lot of time and hard work goes into class placements. Students learning, social, emotional and health needs are all taken into consideration. Sometimes students may not be placed with their friends, and may have been placed with a teacher that is better suited to their needs. As our classes are all full, it is extremely difficult to move students. We encourage students to allow relationships with their teacher and fellow students to settle. However, if you have any concerns, please contact the classroom teacher.

## COMMUNICATION:

  - read the fortnightly newsletter (usually out on a Wednesday) and attached to the website

  - email list (newsletter subscription found on website)

Should you wish to make contact with the school, your child's class teacher is the first point of contact.

## SUN SAFE:

With our Summer finally upon us it is important that our students utilise our 4 steps to ensure that we are a Sun Safe School.

1. Sun block is available in classrooms

## SCHOOL FEES 2020:

Below is a list of costs that will need to be paid throughout the year. These costs can be paid in full, paid weekly, fortnightly, term by term - however is easiest for you! Additional events and activities will come up through the year specific to our learning programmes. Information regarding any events will be available in newsletters, on the website and from your child before the event.

<b>Specialist Subject Fees:</b> This covers materials used in specialist subjects, like Food Tech, Visual Art, etc.	\$80
<b>Beach Ed (Year 8 only):</b> This is taking place in Week 6 and will need to be paid for by 28 February. Information and permission slip will be sent home shortly.	\$30
<b>Spelling Book:</b> This is a resource for a schoolwide spelling programme, and is not part of the stationery box	\$11
<b>Maths Buddy:</b> This is an individualised online maths resource integrated into our Maths programme	\$15
<b>Year 7 Camp:</b> This will take place 8 - 11 September. We are still finalising the costs of buses, etc, but we estimate the cost to be around \$290 (approximately) per student. This amount can be paid off during the year but will need to be paid in full by Friday, 28 August.	\$290 approx
<b>Year 8 EOTC:</b> This will take place 8 - 11 September. We are still finalising the costs of buses, etc, but we estimate the cost to be around \$260 (approximately) per student. This amount can be paid off during the year but will need to be paid in full by Friday, 28 August.	\$260 approx
<b>Donation (optional):</b> This is voluntary but we would really appreciate it if this can be paid, as we are not funded adequately by the Government to provide the rich education we deliver to your child.	\$100



## ATTENDANCE:

As part of our reporting to the Board of Trustees, we report against attendance. This is also shown on your child's school report.

The Ministry of Education outlines attendance rates as follows:

Absence Rates Across the Year			
Acceptable	96%	=	10 days (2 weeks of school missed across the school year)
A concern	90%	=	20 days (4 weeks of missed school, one month)
Critical concern	85%	=	30 days (6 weeks of missed school, over half a term)
Very serious	80%	=	40 days (8 weeks of missed school, nearly one term)

Another interesting, but scary fact - if your child misses one day a fortnight for various reasons, by the time they reach Year 10, they will have missed a whole year of schooling. Absences have a significant impact on a child's learning, please be mindful of this.

School starts at 8.30am each morning, and finishes at 3.00pm. Please make sure your child is on time.

## PIT STOP:

At BMIS we have Pit Stop. This is a refuelling station for our emerging adolescents. Students are able to access Pit Stop - this is FREE. Students and volunteers run Pit Stop - for students by students. Food that is accessible at intervals: fruit, weetbix, snackbars, cold milk and chilled water, bread & spreads with a focus on healthy eating. We do not have a school tuckshop.
