## From The Principal's Desk

Kia ora koutou katoa

WOW! Week 7 zoomed past and Week 8 is upon us.

BMIS is absolutely committed to providing students with the best opportunities for life long learning as we can.

Every class has now completed the Cycle Safety and Road Safety programme with many students learning how to ride a bike. For the staff, not knowing how to ride a bicycle was a foreign concept as we all grew up riding bikes. We now know that all our students can ride a bicycle and know how to be safe on the road as a cyclist and a motorist with an awareness of cyclists.

On Wednesday, 13th June, 40 students experienced a powhiri and sleepover at Hoani Waititi marae. Sir Pita Sharples welcomed our group onto Hoani Waititi and was impressed by our willingness to learn and experience Maori culture. The afternoon and evening was incredible with us being invited to view the Kura's Kapa Haka championship performance of which was performed on Friday night at Aotea Centre. Our students worked with a tutor on Kapa Haka, shared stories, learnt about the positioning of Hoani Waititi within an inclusive iwi nation, and the purpose of a community marae. Students connected with carvings, tukutuku and kowhaiwhai. Students also had fun eating, chipping in with responsibilities and working in the wharekai. An experience that will be treasured by all who attended, forever!

On Thursday, 14th June, four Warriors (yes, real Warriors players) ran a skills session with our rugby and rugby league students. This proved very popular with the students receiving prizes from the Warriors of which were gratefully received. The session was such a success that the Warriors are keen to return to our school and continue to work with our students. We look forward to this. Hosting our visiting international students all the way from China in T3, is a great opportunity to show what true Kiwi hospitality is all about. Hosting one student is \$250 for 7 days and hosting 2 students is \$450 for 7 days. Should this be of interest to you, please contact the school office for more details.

Matariki is the Maori name for a group of seven stars known as the Pleiades star cluster. Some people think of Matariki as a mother star with six daughters, and it is often referred to as the Seven Sisters. Others think that Matariki are the 'eyes of the god'. When Ranginui, the sky father, and Papatūānuku, the earth mother, were separated by their children the god of wind, Tāwhirimātea, became angry, tearing out his eyes and hurling them into the heavens. Matariki appears in the eastern sky sometime around the shortest day of the year, and is thought to determine how successful the harvest crop will be in the coming season. The brighter the stars, the more productive the crop will be. Matariki has two meanings, both of which refer to the cluster of stars. Mata Riki means Tiny Eyes, and Mata Ariki means Eyes of God. Matariki was officially celebrated on June 15th for 2018.

### **Booking your 3 Way Learning Conversation**

The booking website will open Wednesday, 6 June at 3:00 PM, and will close Wednesday, 4 July at 12:45 PM.

- 1. Go to <u>parentinterviews.co.nz</u>, enter the event code **RYFUQ6JQ** and click Go.
- 2. Enter your name, email address and the names of the students you wish to make bookings for.
- 3. Select the teachers you'd like to book by ticking the checkbox beside their name, and then click the Book Interviews button at the bottom of the page.
- 4. Using the timetable, click the Book button beside the time slot you'd like to book for the teacher. You'll be asked to confirm your booking.
- 5. Continue until you've booked all teachers.

All class teachers and specialist subject teachers are available for you to talk with.

Once you're finished, you can view your timetable by clicking My Interviews at the top of the page. You can also print a PDF timetable to take to your 3 Way Learning Conversation.

Before your 3 Way Learning Conversation, you'll receive an email reminder containing your timetable. If you need to cancel any bookings, you can do so by following the link in the email you received when you first signed up.
