REMINDERS:

3 WAY LEARNING CONVERSATIONS:

Tuesday, 6 July from 3.30pm - 8.00pm and Thursday, 8 July from 1.30pm - 6.00pm, BMIS will be hosting our Report Evening. This is a discussion with parents/caregivers, students and teachers as to how your child is progressing with their learning thus far in 2021.

BUS TIMES & PARKING:

BMIS is currently are working with Ritchies to pick up bus students to as close to 3:00pm as possible. **PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE BUS BAY**. Bus scheduling is a work in progress.

SCHOOL ENTRY:

So that our students are kept as dry as possible, they will be entering school through the Hall Foyer doors off Bruce McLaren Road or the pathway from Silverstone Place and not through the silver gates for the rest of Term 2 and for Term 3 as of Monday, 21 June. Students will exit at 3:00pm through the silver gates and pedestrian gate by the Pedestrian Crossing or using the pathway onto Silverstone Place. We hope that this is helpful and more efficient for our students. Late students will still need to enter school through the office.

Y7 CAMP / Y8 OFFSITE EXPERIENCE:

The cost for Year 7 Camp is \$300 per student, and the cost for the Year 8 Experience is \$270 (plus \$30 for Beach Ed). We are again offering a '2 FOR 1' deal. If you have two siblings living in the same house, you will only need to pay \$300 for both to attend.

These costs can be paid in full, paid weekly, fortnightly, term by term - however is easiest for you! Full payment is due by Friday, 20 August.
