Amended Health & Safety Policy

At our last Board of Trustees meeting is was written into our Health and Safety Policy that any wheeled transportation that students use (are in charge of) to get to school MUST be accompanied with the rider wearing a helmet. For example, bicycle, unicycle, hoverboard, scooter, skates... Please ensure that your child is wearing a helmet when riding to and from school. The transportation will be held at school if found to be brought to school without a helmet, until such time as a helmet comes to school or a parent/caregiver collects. The wellbeing of our students is paramount.

NZEI Update

Again I bring to your attention progress to date of NZEI.

The key thing we, members of NZEI, want to communicate is why we need to take industrial action. It's about our kids' futures. As a mother I often hear my child say "...we had a reliever again today. Don't know who will be there tomorrow". This is not good enough for my child. This is not good enough for anyone's child.
