EFFORT REPORTS

Effort Reports will be brought home by your child on Friday, 16th March in a sealed envelope addressed to their parent/s or caregiver/s.

The Effort Report is useful feedback for your child and for us as parents/caregivers. There is sound evidence that determination and perseverance are hugely important to many school outcomes that most people care about. There is also evidence that students' beliefs about effort are important. When students believe that effort leads to achievement, they are more likely to work hard, and not to get discouraged by failure, because they believe that, with more effort, they can succeed. And at Bruce McLaren Intermediate School that is what we do: DREAM BELIEVE ACHIEVE!

TRAVELWISE

In November 2017, six Year 8 School Councillors with Auckland Transport used the Speed Radar to measure the speeds of vehicles passing our school gate from 8:15 - 8:30am. At this time the actual speed is zoned for 40km/hr.

120 vehicle speeds were capture. 52 km/hr was the highest speed captured. 24km/hr was the lowest speed captured. The average speed over this time was 39km/hr.

There were 46 vehicles speeding at this time which means 38% of drivers passing our school gate are breaking the law by speeding in a 40km/hr zone.

Some slogans the students came up with are:

Keep speed down - don't be a clown!
We CARE - Kids near!
Go slow and keep the flow.
We need to be alive to learn!
Drive with care - students near.
Look out - kids about.

- 2. Enter your name, email address and the names of the students you wish to make bookings for.
- 3. Select the teachers you'd like to book by ticking the checkbox beside their name, and then click the Book Interviews button at the bottom of the page.
- 4. Using the timetable, click the Book button beside the time slot you'd like to book for the teacher. You'll be asked to confirm your booking.
- 5. Continue until you've booked all teachers.

Once you're finished, you can view your timetable by clicking My Interviews at the top of the page. You can also print a PDF timetable to take to your interviews.

Before your interviews, you'll receive an email reminder containing your timetable. If you need to cancel any interviews, you can do so by following the link in the email you received when you first signed up.


