These students have been working diligently behind the scenes to ensure that BMIS is the best place it can be for students.

There are three School Council sub-groups – Transformers, Strategic Thinkers and Citizenship.

The Citizenship group are running a NO UNIFORM DAY where school rules still apply and learning continues, on **Friday, 13th April**. This mufti day is to celebrate the end of term, end of Summer, end of Daylight Savings, ANZAC DAY and support our Commonwealth Games Team. **BLACK OUT DAY** is a day to wear black clothes to school. The cost is \$2. BLACK OUT DAY is not a compulsory mufti day. Students will either be in mufti (preferably black) or in full school uniform. This is our first mufti day in two years.
