#### **EARLY SCHOOL CLOSE:**

It is regrettable that so early in the term the school will be closing on Thursday, 9th May at 12:30pm for a Paid Union Meeting for NZEI members. NZEI members made it clear by the scale of the "reject" vote late last term that the government's offers were not sufficient to address the crisis we face. That crisis is based on the significant under-resourcing of education in New Zealand that has led to teachers and principals facing increasingly unmanageable workloads. We continue to have very strong parental and community support for our campaign and we want to thank you for this. The objective is to ensure a bright future for all of our students, their children and their children's children.

#### **BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS:**

Over the course of the term break there was much work undertaken. The hall floor is being resurfaced as you read this, the roofing has been replaced over the Admin area so we will not have to have buckets in offices this Winter, the roofing over Room 9, Pit Stop and MindPlus has been replaced, the roofing over the Multipurpose/Performing Arts Room has also been replaced. The old bin shed has been demolished, a manky garden area is being concreted in for more playing area, the PE shed has had a makeover, trees devastating drains have been removed and the painting journey continues.

#### SCHOOL LOCKDOWN:

**Important Information:** At the end of Term 1, Glen Eden Primary went into lockdown. If we were in lockdown this is what we would do in this situation: If the police ring us telling us to go into lockdown, we have an

outdoor alarm that rings continuously for 10 seconds. We then announce over the classroom speakers advising the teachers that we are in lockdown. Students crouch by the classroom walls, preferably with their backs to the windows and below window height, until the all-clear is given. Teachers email the office to account for all students.

We will put information on our Facebook page as well as send out a message on SkoolLoop and email to all families. We will also send out regular updates by SkoolLoop and emails in addition to updating our Facebook page.

If you try to ring the school, you may get cut off or the phone may not get answered as the system can get overloaded and we will all be very busy keeping the children safe.

During a lockdown no student is allowed to go home as it is not safe. Please do not come to pick them up.

Fingers crossed, we never have to implement the plan.
