RAMADAN MUBARAK!

"Ramadan Kareem" or "Ramadan Mubarak" are the appropriate greetings at the beginning of the month - means "Blessed/Generous Ramadan"

This is the month where the Muslim contingent of the community go into a month of fasting, self reflection, humility and gratitude.

Eight BMIS students and one staff member will be fasting for the next month, from sunrise to sunset (at the moment it's about 5.30am to 5.20pm) not a long day considering the other hemisphere is doing this in their summer!! Most students will be waking before 5am to eat and drink something.

Fasting means no eating or drinking. So no water etc. At BMIS we are being considerate with our students when they are out for PE/Fitness. Some students in the past have pushed through and want to keep participating, and some students have preferred to sit out. If they are to sit out from PE/fitness during the whole month please send a note along with your child indicating that they are fasting for Ramadan.

Part of the fast is to self reflect on behaviour and think about their religion. If they are fasting, they can not swear, say mean things or generally be impolite and disrespectful.

The Global Learning Room will be available for those who want to pray/ have a chill out space.

Lastly, the students are not starving themselves, they are taking part in one of the most sacred pillars of Islam. It takes a lot of self control and commitment to do this and one of the reasons our staff member loves advocating for these students is because when she first came to NZ, she felt like such an outsider and weirdo for taking part in something so different (but special) for her religion, culture and family.

At the end of the month there is the celebration called Eid al Fitr (A breaking of fast celebration) Consider this as the Muslim Christmas, it lasts 3 days and sometimes families like to spend it together at home. This is around the 14/15 of June. (Moon sighting dependent).

Thank you to Mrs Mohamed for supporting our students and educating us all at this time.
