From The Principal's Desk

I hope that everyone had a positive Queen's Birthday Weekend.

Last week was full of successes. Samoan Language Week saw students teaching students and staff phrases, words, songs and games. It was also an accomplishment as Ta Fia Falealili Fua had a so'otaga with Waimahia Intermediate School and Kowhai Intermediate School Samoan bilingual classes. Our students were amazing. Their speeches were clear and warmly received, their dancing was brilliant and their behaviour was outstanding. We can be very proud of our Samoan Identity, Language & Culture (ILC) class. Congratulations to the students in attendance at this special event. Thank you to Mr Leusoga Mauga for being our expert teacher for the Ava Ceremony and the many fanau who supported our students it is always much appreciated.

Room 8 cycled their way to learning more about road safety, as have Room 1 and Room 4. The weather has been in our favour and students are developing their Key Competencies - thinking, relating to others, using language, symbols, and texts, managing self, participating and contributing.

The girls' Football (soccer) teams competed at WZAIMS and played superbly. Jenny, our SWiS, coached these teams and the girls' results reflect their intensive training and positive attitude as the competition was extremely high this year.

This week is jammed packed with events and activities of which our students are involved in. More classes will experience Cycle Safety, a large contingent are at WZAIMS Cross Country as I write the newsletter, Waitakere College sports tasters for some Year 8s, Opportunities Day, WZAIMS Turbo Touch to name a few.

Along with this, the School Council are participating in a Community Clean Up on Friday along with

people assisting with this project - Tag Out, Police, Henderson Community Patrol (CPNZ), site residents, business owners and staff. Our school believes in being a positive, actively contributing entity of our community. Having a clean, safe and healthy community reflects positively on the well being of all who live, work and/or pass through our small corner of the world.

As you will have seen in the media there is a nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers. At this stage, BMIS is fully staffed with great teachers but pressure is on in the Primary and Secondary sectors.

While there are many more children coming into the school system, there are not enough new teachers being trained. Urgent and significant changes are needed to ensure that the teaching profession can attract the people it needs and to ensure class sizes do not start to increase to unacceptable levels.

On Friday, 22nd June, the teachers from this school will be attending a NZEI Te Riu Roa paid union meeting regarding the Kua Tae Te Wā - It's Time campaign. The campaign aims to free teachers to teach and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. The meetings will allow our teachers to discuss how the Ministry of Education has responded to changes that the union is seeking.

Our teaching staff are members of NZEI and legally entitled to attend this meeting. The teachers will be leaving school on Friday, 22 June at 1pm, to attend their paid union meeting which starts at 2pm.

I strongly encourage parents to make arrangements to pick their child(ren) up from the school office by 1.00pm on Friday, 22 June. If you are unable to pick your children up then, please advise us so that your children can be supervised until 3pm.

Please fill in the slip in this newsletter and have it returned to the school office no later than Monday, 18 June.

I appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for families. However, I encourage you to support your teachers as they strive to achieve the changes which will safeguard quality education for all children and ensure we make teaching an attractive profession for graduates.
